




**DID YOU KNOW?** Dingos do not smell like domestic dogs allowing them to stay hidden from predators.

Kangaroos live in social groups called mobs. This kangaroo is lonely. Can you draw a habitat for him and a mob to join?


Remember to draw food, water and some shelter like trees.

Help the wombat find his way home.




**DID YOU KNOW?** The Common Wombat can dig a tunnel system, with tunnels ranging anywhere from 2 to 20 metres in length.
